



REPORT: AIRLINES: MIDDLE EAST

What you need to know

February 2023

This report presents a roundup of what's been happening to airlines in the Middle East over the last month.

Major carriers

Etihad Airways

Lisbon joining network

From July 2, Etihad Airways will expand its European network with the start of three weekly flights from Abu Dhabi to Lisbon, Portugal.

Turkish Airlines

January passenger numbers up by more than a half

During January, Turkish Airlines carried 6.09 million passengers. This was up 56% year-over-year. With revenue passenger kilometers rising by 70% on 39% growth in capacity, the airline's load factor advanced 14.8 points to 81%.

Other airlines

Air Arabia

New routes from Abu Dhabi

Low-cost carrier Air Arabia's Abu Dhabi division will start a new thrice-weekly service from Abu Dhabi to Amman, Jordan, from March 12. It will be the airline's 27th destination from Abu Dhabi. Kolkata will become its 28th destination and seventh in India, when thrice-weekly services start on March 15.

The airline is also planning to launch two routes to Iraq. Twice-weekly flights to Baghdad will begin on June 22. Flights at the same frequency will start to Erbil on September 15.

Passenger numbers drive up 2022 results

UAE-based Air Arabia saw its turnover rise by 65% to Dh5.2 billion in 2022, as passenger numbers almost doubled to 12.8 million. Annual net profit jumped by 70% to Dh1.2 billion (US\$327 million).

Air Astana

Strong demand drives up profits

Kazakh carrier Air Astana improved annual revenue in 2022 by 36% to just over \$1 billion. Passenger numbers rose by 11% to 7.35 million, helping to drive a more than doubling in profits to \$78.4 million.

Beijing service resumes

Air Astana will resume twice-weekly flights from Astana to Beijing from March 18. It will also increase frequency on its existing Almaty-Beijing service to four times weekly, before increasing it further to daily during the summer.

ELAI

New Tokyo service starting

Israeli carrier El Al will start twice-weekly flights from Tel Aviv to Tokyo Narita on March 2, the first scheduled service linking Israel and Japan.

Flydubai

Mogadishu joining network

Low-cost carrier Flydubai will add Mogadishu, Somalia, to its network from March 9. It will initially operate daily services from Dubai, rising to double-daily from June 1.

Jazeera Airways

Profits slump in Q4 2022

Kuwaiti low-cost carrier Jazeera Airways increased fourth quarter 2022 revenues by 25% year-over-year to KD41.3 million. This was driven by an 88% increase in passengers to 978,000. However, Jazeera's quarterly operating profit slumped by 91% to just KD900,000 (US\$2.9 million). It also reported a KD700,000 net loss, a steep reversal from 2021's KD7 million net profit.

Samarkand service starting in March

On March 1, Jazeera Airways will launch new twice-weekly non-stop services between Kuwait and Samarkand in Uzbekistan. It already serves Tashkent and Namangan.

Oman Air

Four new summer destinations

As part of its summer 2023 schedule, Oman Air will start four new routes from Muscat. From the end of March, it will start four weekly flights to Chittagong in Bangladesh, followed by four weekly flights to the Maldives from the end of June. During August, Oman Air will also launch 12 weekly flights to Lucknow and five times weekly services to Thiruvananthapuram in India.

Royal Jordanian

New services

Royal Jordanian Airlines will launch a number of new services this summer. From Amman, it will resume regular non-stop flights to Algiers from March 16, with services to Manama, Bahrain, following in June. It will also begin twice-weekly flights to Stockholm on May 29 and to Düsseldorf on September 23. Royal Jordanian will further offer twice-weekly flights to Al-Ula in Saudi Arabia from September.
