

REPORT: AIRLINES: NORTHEAST ASIA

What you need to know

December 2024

This report presents a roundup of what's been happening to airlines in Northeast Asia over the last month.

Major airlines

ANA

Two new European routes for 2025

Japanese carrier ANA has started thrice-weekly services from Tokyo Haneda to Milan Malpensa as part of a major expansion of its European network.

Cathay Pacific

Two new European routes for 2025

Cathay Pacific is to add Munich to its European network in 2025, when it will also resume services to Brussels. The four-times weekly Munich service will start on June 16. Flights to Brussels at the same frequency will restart on June 16.

Japan Airlines

New IndiGo codeshare launches

Japan Airlines launched a new codeshare with Indian carrier IndiGo on December 16. The arrangement initially covers IndiGo's domestic services that connect to JAL's daily flights from Tokyo Haneda to Delhi and five-times weekly flights from Tokyo Narita to Bangalore. JAL's passengers will now be able to connect to Ahmedabad, Amritsar, Chandigarh, Chennai, Coimbatore, Goa, Hyderabad, Kochi, Kolkata, Leh, Lucknow, Mumbai, Pune, Thiruvananthapuram, Trichy and Varanasi.

The codeshare also includes JAL's flights from Bangkok and Singapore to Haneda and Narita and from Bangkok to Osaka.

Korean Air

Asiana merger completed

Korean Air has closed the W1.5 trillion (US\$1.05 billion) acquisition of local rival Asian Airlines, four years since the deal was originally announced. Asiana is now a subsidiary of Korean Air. Integration of the two companies is expected to take two years, and this will include diversified schedules on overlapping routes.

The enlarged Korean Air Group, which includes low-cost divisions Air Busan, Air Seoul and Jin Air, operates a combined fleet of 291 aircraft.

Other airlines

Hainan Airlines

Boost to Singapore services

At the start of January 2025, China's Hainan Airlines will boost its services to Singapore. It will start fourtimes weekly flights from Lanzhou and thrice-weekly services from Yichang. Both routes will operate with a stop *en route* in Haikou. Its standalone Haikou-Singapore service will at the same time see its frequency increase from five per week to daily.

Hong Kong Airlines

Vancouver services to resume

Hong Kong Airlines is to resume twice-weekly services to Vancouver from January 18 using Airbus A330-300s. It suspended the services in February 2020.

Shanghai Airlines

International services expanding

China Eastern-owned Shanghai Airlines is busy expanding its international services. During December, it added thrice-weekly Changchun-Yuncheng-Kuala Lumpur services and daily Changchun-Shanghai Pudong-Bangkok flights.

On January 19, 2025, Shanghai Airlines will also launch thrice-weekly services from Shanghai Pudong to Casablanca, Morocco.

Starlux

Two new Japanese routes announced for 2025

Taiwanese carrier Starlux plans to launch direct flights to Kobe, Japan, in April 2025. Using Airbus A321neo aircraft, it will operate daily flights from Taichung and three-weekly flights from Taipei. Kobe becomes the airline's 11th Japanese destination.

Toki Air

Third aircraft joins regional fleet

Having only started services in January 2024, Japanese regional carrier Toki Air has added a third aircraft to its fleet. The ATR 42-600 joins a pair of ATR 72-600s already in operation.

Low-cost carriers

Greater Bay Airlines

New Chinese service launched

Hong Kong-based low-cost carrier Greater Bay Airlines commenced scheduled services to Yichang in China's Hubei province on December 17. It's offering thrice-weekly service.



West Air

Third aircraft joins regional fleet

Chinese carrier West Air will launch thrice-weekly flights from Lhasa in the Tibet Autonomous Region to Singapore via Chongqing on December 25.
